Dr. Mark Lewis passed away on Wednesday, December 26, 2018 in Tyler. He was born July 27, 1951 in Minneapolis, MN to Carroll and Evelyn Lewis. Mark graduated from Valley Forge High School in Parma Heights, Ohio in 1969, and he was an Eagle Scout. He received his undergraduate degree from Miami University of Ohio in 1973. Mark went on to earn his Master's Degree in 1982 and his Doctorate in Education in 1985 from the University of Northern Colorado. He was an educational psychologist at The University of Texas at Tyler for 32 years in the Department of Curriculum and Instruction. During his tenure there, he served as department chair, associate dean, graduate program advisor, and he was on the university research committee. Mark was a member of Southwest Educational Research Association in which he served as President in 1996. In the late 1980's and early 1990's he took prospective teachers to Germany and Scotland in a foreign exchange program that he created. He was well respected by his colleagues and beloved by his students.

Mark married Lauren (Lauri) Perry and became father to Sarah Perry on June 3, 1995. He became a soccer dad, and he was there for them in every way possible. For Sarah, he was not a stepfather but a true dad in every sense of the word. Mark was also known for his love of their family dogs and cats.

Mark was preceded in death by his parents Carroll and Evelyn Lewis, and his brother Scott Lewis. He is survived by his wife Lauren (Lauri) Fisher Perry and his daughter, Sarah Elise Perry.
