Temple Rice Holt, age 85 of Tyler, Texas, passed away on December 10, 2020. Temple was born on August 15, 1935 in Tyler, Texas to Gilbert Foy and Florence Yaughn Holt of Tyler. He lived in Tyler throughout his life and graduated from Tyler High School. He married the love of his life, Sylvia Vines Holt, on June 15, 1956. He worked at Red Ball Motor Freight, Trane, and retired after several years of working at his trucking company, Shining Silver Inc. Temple was an active member of First Baptist Church – Gresham. 
