



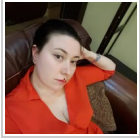
Adam Shackelford

Dr. Browne was marvelous about the matter. She brought her dog to school -- so Jacque should bring her baby to school. Simple as that! And then I got "diaper duty." So did a lot of us in Las Mascaras. Jacque never missed teaching a class or directing a production on the TJC stage and Adam -- PRECIOUS, Adam --- was always "in-tow." His "baby years" were special to all of us. We had MANY stories --- and some were repeated --- much to Adam's chagrin --- during honors in 2000 for Dr. Browne.
