Al was born to the late Pete and Carmen Rocha on Sept. 13, 1943 in Athens. He lived in Tyler for the last 40 years coming from Kemp where he graduated high school. Al then graduated from Roffler Barber College and owned and operated Al's Barber Shop. He later graduated from TJC with a music degree and was a member and music director at North Drive Baptist Church.
