



Allen Peithman,

December 29, 1941 - June 23, 2009

Memorial services for Allen E. Peithman, Sr., 67, Hideaway, are scheduled for 2 p.m., Tuesday June 30 at Stewart Family Funeral Home, Tyler, with Dr. David O Dykes officiating. The family will receive friends at the funeral home beginning at 1 p.m. directly before the service. Mr. Peithman died June 23 at East Texas Medical Center in Tyler. He was born December 29, 1941 in Fairbury, Nebraska to the late Marie and Ernst Peithman. He graduated from Hebron High School in Hebron, Nebraska, where he was an all-state basketball player. Mr. Peithman went on to Kansas State University where he was a standout starter on their nationally ranked basketball team. He graduated in 1964 with a BA in business and BS in speech. He went on to play semi-pro basketball for the Goodyear Wingfoots in Akron, OH, and served in the U.S. Army. He had a 30 year career in the equipment leasing business, retiring in 2003. Allen married the love of his life in 1999 and they moved to Hideaway Lake, he from Plano, TX and she from Tulsa, OK. Allen Peithman had a 50 year love affair with the game of golf, still carrying a single-digit handicap at the time of his death.

During his lifetime, he was involved in a wide variety of community organizations serving in many capacities. Survivors include wife, Nancy, Hideaway; son Allen Peithman, Jr. Lincoln, Nebraska; step-sons, Bill Hadley, Tulsa, OK; and John Hadley, wife Cheryl, and two granddaughters, Elizabeth and Eden Hadley, Rancho Cucamonga, California; sister, Ann Grummert, Nashville, TN, brother, Loren Peithmann and wife Kathy, Hebron,

Nebraska.

“ My first encounter with Al Peithman was when he was playing basketball at K-State. Al being from Hebron, Nebraska should never have gone to K-State but that is what he ended up doing and as you might know he always had his best game of the season against Nebraska, especially playing in Lincoln.

The next time I ran into Al was at Goodyear Tire & Rubber. When Al finished college he took a job in the Goodyear management training program in Akron and played basketball for their semi-pro team the Wingfoots. After a couple years in Akron they moved him to a plant in Lincoln for a position as a Sales Engineer. I was working in the same office and it seemed like we became friends almost instantaneously. I was married to Mili, a stunningly beautiful lady with an awesome personality and she and Al got along extremely well. Al had this yellow Corvette and being single and the handsome guy he was he was a high profile on the Lincoln social scene. Nonetheless he always had time for the Bakers, especially when Mili invited him over for dinner.

Our friendship continued over the years through many of the other happenings in Al's life and the Baker's as well. Ultimately I started my own company Cyclonaire and we made a couple attempts to hire Al but it never did happen.

Once Al made the move to Texas we stayed connected for a few years but sort of lost contact. My last social time with Al was with he and Nancy at dinner in Mineola. This was 10 years ago not long after Mili passed away.

I never have done a tribute like this before but Al was a very special person and friend. He was bigger than life as a person and as a friend.

It is so ironic that we were in Tyler three weeks ago with my brothers family. Another friend of both Al and I from Goodyear, Howard Fager, we were going to have dinner with Al and

Nancy.

During our short stay in Tyler I visited Al in the hospital on two occasions. The first time I walked into his room totally unannounced in his booming voice he says "WELL DON BAKER"
