



Alva Lorraine Borowsky Rath

April 12, 1929 - February 14, 2023

We announce the death of Alva Lorraine Rath, 93, who passed peacefully into the arms of her Savior on February 14, 2023 at Meadow Lake Skilled Care Facility in Tyler, TX.

Born April 12, 1929 in Conneaut, Ohio to Alfred and Blanche (Mansfield) Borowsky, Lorraine married Charles V. Rath, who predeceased her March 1, 2011.

Besides managing the home and raising her children to love God, Lorraine served in many capacities: a Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN), a volunteer Girl Scout leader, a school bus driver, and school cafeteria manager. For many years, she volunteered as a dispatcher and EMT for the Concord Rescue Squad, attended First Assembly of God in Lynchburg, VA. and later was a founding member of Thomas Terrace Baptist Church in Lynchburg.

Lorraine and Charles retired to Florida in 1994 and later moved to Texas to live with their daughter, Linda. After Charles died in 2011, Lorraine moved to Tyler, TX with her daughter and attended Redeeming Grace Fellowship Assembly of God.

She is survived by her children: Dr. Linda L. Rath, Lt. Col. Charles V. Rath, Jr. (retired), and Dr. G. David Rath, and by three grandchildren: Shawn, Aaron,

and Josiah.

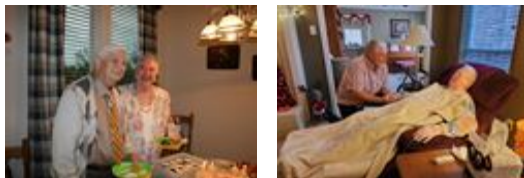

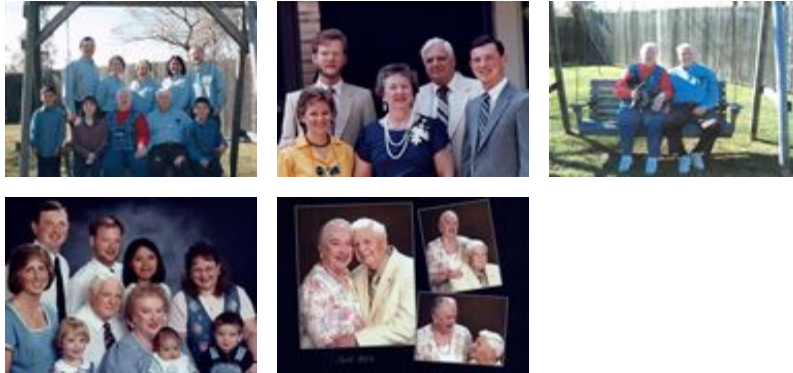

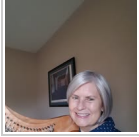
