A Celebration of Life memorial service for Cheryl L. Rasor, 52, of Tyler, will be held on Tuesday, December 7, 2010 at 11:00 AM at Green Acres Baptist Church Chapel with Rev. Mrs. Rasor passed away on December 3, 2010 at Hospice of East Texas in Tyler after a one and a half year battle with breast cancer. She was born April 18, 1958 in Corpus Christi to Morris Lee and Naomi Dunnam Baker. She was raised in Corpus Christi and moved to Tyler to attend Tyler Junior College, where she was an Apache Belle. Her love of dancing continued throughout her life. After raising her children, Mrs. Rasor began her career, working at the University of Texas Health Center. She was employed by Tyler Cardiovascular Consultants as a research nurse for the past 12 years until her death. She was an active member of Green Acres Baptist Church.

Mrs. Rasor was preceded in death by her father, Morris Lee Baker and her sister, Deborah Kay Doiron.
