Clyde graduated from Archer City High School and attended Draughons Business School in Wichita Falls. The family moved to Tyler in 1970; Clyde worked for Safeway Grocery Company for 26 ½ years as a Market Manager. Following his retirement from Safeway, he owned and operated Clydes West Erwin Meat Market for 13 years. Clyde was a long time member of Green Acres Baptist Church serving as a Deacon. He was also a member of the Rowland Lane Sunday Morning Bible Study Class. Clyde enjoyed fishing, hunting and working cattle. He was a loving husband, father, grand and great-grandfather. Mr. Loudamy was preceded in death by his parents, and brother James Leslie Loudamy.
