August 25, 1952 - November 4, 2007

On Sunday, November 4, 2007, David M. Irby, Sr. was called to his Savior's side. Born in Tyler, Texas on August 25, 1952, David entered eternity from his home in Bullard, Texas. He attended Robert E. Lee High School and entered the United States Air Force, later becoming an entrepreneur. During his career, David owned several businesses, including East Texas Fence Company and most recently Tract Research and Acquisition Company of Texas, Incorporated (TRACT, Inc.). Far surpassing these achievements, David was a cherished husband, father and son. He was adored by many and touched more lives than can be counted. He lived his life by Romans 13:8 "Let no debt remain outstanding, except the continuing debt to love one another, for he who loves his fellowman has fulfilled the law."
