



David Robinson

November 11, 1925 - May 27, 2007

Dr. David Lee Robinson died at his home on May 27, 2007 in Tyler, Texas after a brief battle with cancer. He was born November 11, 1925 in St. Louis, Missouri and lived in Jerseyville, Illinois as a boy. He moved to Dallas Texas at age 12 and graduated from Woodrow Wilson High School. He served in the United States Army in World War II. After his return from the war, he attended SMU and UT Southwestern Medical School in Dallas, followed by a residency in radiology at the Bowman Gray School of Medicine in Winston-Salem, North Carolina. He then served in the United States Air Force from 1959-62 as a radiologist, attaining the rank of Major. After separating from the military, David practiced radiology in Greenwood, SC and Ft. Worth, Texas before moving to Tyler in 1965 to open his own practice, which he continued until his retirement in 1997. He is survived by his four children and their spouses: Lisa Robinson Weiss and Bob of Tampa, FL, Kyle Robinson and Mary Lynn of Menlo Park, CA, Duke Robinson and Amanda of Montreal, Canada, and Lee Ann Robinson Tatum and John of Dallas. He is also survived by six grandchildren: Alyssa and Lauren Robinson, Meg and Ali Weiss, and Jack and Katie Tatum. His mother, Tallulah LaClede, preceded him in death.
