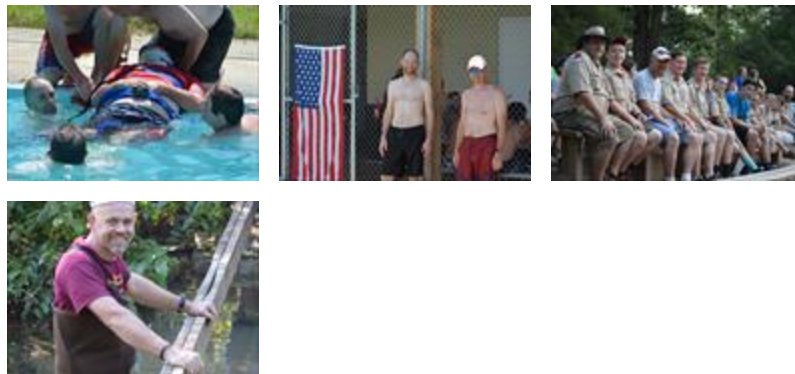

“ It was a pleasure and privilege to work with David through the Veterans Roundtable and the East Texas Veterans Alliance. He and Andrea were always so helpful and generous with their time and expertise. David was the person responsible for helping the Alliance get a professional logo we could be proud of when we had virtually no money. That will be a part of his legacy that lives on in our community.

David was the post-9/11 featured veteran for Veteran Studies Weekly, a national military friendly schools curriculum. He taught me so much about his life as an avionics mechanic and artist during our interview. Many people don't know that David painted ladder doors on A-10A Thunderbolts as well as murals in airplane hangars! His art is exhibited in the Bentwaters Museum in England. He thought about rescuing airplane art from decommissioned aircraft in the "boneyard" in Tuscon, Arizona. This is another legacy he created in his life, helping school children understand the multifaceted lives of America's service members.

When I remember David, I will remember his smiling face and the little green monster he painted on the door of Warthog #0944 with its mysterious electrical system problems.
