Services for Clayton Dean Boyd, 61, of Tyler will be held on Thursday, January 29, 2009 at 2:00 PM in the chapel of Stewart Family Funeral Home with Rev. Linda Owens officiating. Private burial will be at Kendrick Cemetery under the direction of Stewart Family Funeral Home. Mr. Boyd passed away on January 25, 2009 at his home in Tyler. He was born on October 2, 1947 in Tyler to the late Ray and Thelma Boyd. He was a 1966 graduate of Robert E. Lee High School. After graduation, he was drafted into the United States Army and served in the Vietnam War. During his service, Dean was awarded the National Defense Service Medal, the Vietnam Service Medal with two bronze service stars, the Republic of Vietnam Campaign Medal, the Purple Heart, the Sharpshooter Rifle Medal and the Expert M-60 Medal. After his discharge, he had a 35-year career as a truck driver, working for Southland Corporation, Groendyke Transportation, and Buckley's Transportation. He also served as a reserve officer with the Smith County Sheriff. Mr. Boyd is survived by a loving family including his wife of 17 years, Jo Ann Boyd of Tyler; two sons, Brad Boyd of Lindale and David Hick of Norfolk, Virginia; two daughters, Tammi McAdams of Lindale and Melissa Taylor and husband Nick of Tyler; five granddaughters, Courtney Smith, Kayla Boyd, Kristian Boyd, Britney Boyd, and Erica Boyd; brother, Glen Boyd and wife Brenda of Livingston; and sister, Catherine Graham of Cleveland.
