Graveside Service for Don O. Ellis, 80, of Tyler, are scheduled for 2:00 PM Friday, February 15, 2008 at the Colonial Gardens Cemetery in Marshall with Father Ed Baggett officiating under the direction of Stewart Family Funeral Home; 7525 Old Jacksonville Hwy in Tyler. Mr. Ellis passed away February 12, 2008 at his home in Tyler. He was born February 14, 1927 in Higgins, TX to the late Arch and Florence (Ray) Ellis, his mother, a homemaker and gifted seamstress and his father, a rancher and contractor. At age 17 he joined the US Navy despite the fact that he had already lost his older brother in World War II. He was a radio operator during critical times aboard destroyer escorts in the European and North African theaters. Following the war, Don took advantage of the GI bill and attended school at the University of Wisconsin, and ultimately graduated from the University of Nebraska in 1950. He was later called back to duty when the Korean War broke out. Mr. Ellis worked for and retired from Commercial Union Insurance Company after twenty plus years and later worked as an independent claims consultant. In 1969 he served as President of the Monroe Claims Association. He was a confirmed Episcopalian and attended Christ Church. Don was preceded in death by his parents and two sisters, Anna B. Gayle and Juanita Pratt; and one brother, Ray Ellis. Survivors include his wife of 41 years, Molly (Bogue) Ellis of Tyler; daughter, Valarie Ellis Gipson and husband Lee of Atlanta, GA; four grandchildren, Molly and Erin Seamans of Atlanta, GA, Austin Seamans of Laurinburg, NC, and Madison Hix of Atlanta, GA.
