He was born April 21, 1947 in Dallas to Harold Pace Brown and Billie Gene Baker. He was involved in the local ham radio club, photography guild, and volunteer photographer for the Humane Society. He graduated from South Oak Cliff High in Dallas. Mr. Brown was the owner and operator of DB Technology for 20 years. His hobbies were photography and electronics, which were developed in high school. Electronics became his profession. He was self taught and he developed the first computer operated control board for residential aerobic waste systems. His name appears on several patents, related to the products. He was preceded in death by his father Harold Brown. He is survived by his loving wife of 27 years, Rose Brown of Flint; two sons David Brown and Charlie Brown both of Garland; grandson Zachary Brown and mother Tracy Brown of Garland; mother Gene Tibbits of Whitehouse; step-mother Sue Brown of Waxahachie; Sister Vicki Bateson and husband Ron of Mansfield.
