



Earl Swindell

December 3, 1934 - February 11, 2005

Services for Earl Dean Swindell, 70, of Flint, Texas will be 10:00 a.m., Tuesday, February 15, 2005, at Lane's Chapel United Methodist Church in Tyler, Texas with the Rev. Lou Thomas officiating. Burial will follow at Cathedral in the Pines Cemetery. Mr. Swindell died Friday, February 11, 2005 in a Tyler hospital. Services are entrusted to Stewart Family Funeral Home, of south Tyler. Earl Swindell was born December 3, 1934 to Andy Earl and Ruby Floyd Swindell in Milton, Texas. Mr. Swindell was a U. S. veteran of the Korean War. He lived in the Tyler area for the last five years coming from Carrollton. He was a member/usher of First United Methodist Church in Carrollton, Texas and Lane's Chapel United Methodist Church in Tyler for 30 years. Mr. Swindell worked at Otis Engineering for 25 years in Carrollton and worked at Gucci's International in Dallas. He was the world's greatest story teller and will always be remembered as a wonderful husband, father and grandfather. In Jane's words, "he was the nicest man I ever met". He is survived by his wife, Jane Swindell of Flint; son, Brian Swindell and wife, Christi of Plano; two daughters, Karen Merriman and husband, Tom, of Katy and Sharon Swindell of Richardson; three grandchildren, Elizabeth and Jack Swindell and Kathryn Merriman; sister, Edna Jaynes and husband J.P. of Atlanta; two brothers, Charles Swindle and Kenneth Swindell both of Paris; numerous nieces and nephews. Mr. Swindell was preceded in death by one sister and one brother. The family will receive friends from 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. Monday, Feb. 14, 2005 at Stewart Family Funeral Home, Tyler.
