Services for Edith Dane Smith, 97, of Tyler, will be held on Tuesday, August 30, 2011 at 2:00 PM at First Presbyterian Church with Dr. Stuart Baskin officiating.

Mrs. Smith passed away, Wednesday, August 24, 2011 in Tyler.

She was born May 6, 1914 in Woodland, California to Peter C. and Hattie Belle Griffin Dane. She moved to Albuquerque, New Mexico where she met and married her husband, Kelley Smith of Tyler. She arrived in Tyler in 1943 where she raised her family and found friends throughout the years. She attended the First Presbyterian Church as long as she was able.

Her life progressed with the city itself. Edith saw the old courthouse town down and the new one built, Broadway opened up south of the cemetery and on the north, where an underpass was built and opened to the loop. Mrs. Smith saw East Front become the Kilgore Highway and West Front become Athens Highway. Likewise, Beckham was opened and a large medical community established. She saw circuses come to town and set up in Bergfield Center and her dentist now has an office in the East Side Lake, later known as Victory Lake. Tyler Junior College moved from its old high school building to their present campus. UT Tyler, formerly Tyler State of Texas Eastern University also moved from Roberts Junior High to a new campus all its own.

In addition to her parents Mrs. Smith was preceded in death by her husband, Kelley Smith.

She is survived by her loving family including sons; Dane H. Smith and wife Rebecca and Troy V. Smith, all of Tyler.
