Ernie Hudnall, 92, a retired supervisor for 36 years with Amoco Oil Company, went to be with our Lord on Saturday, August 9, 2014 in Tyler, Texas.

He was born February 20, 1922 in Burkburnett, Texas and remained in that area until his enlistment into the United States Army. Ernie joined on January 5, 1940 to serve with the 1st Infantry Division in North Africa. He fought battles in Algeria-French Morocco, Tunisia, Sicily, Normandy, North France, Rhineland, Ardennes-Alsace and Central Europe. After his service, Ernie was awarded the EAME Campaign Medal with 8 Bronze Stars, the Bronze Star Medal for the 1st U.S. Infantry Division, the Distinguished Unit Badge, the American Defense Service Medal, and the Good Conduct Medal. He was a Life Member of Veterans of Foreign Wars and The Society of the 1st Infantry Division. He was also a member of Woods Baptist Church in Tyler, Texas.

Ernie is survived by his loving family including his wife, Jewell Deen; daughter and son-in-law, Cheryl Ann and Ronald Breaux of Nacogdoches; grandson, Scott Revia of Hobbs, New Mexico. His second family includes his step-daughter and son-in-law, Carmon and Rick Paez; grandson, Chuck Bell and his wife Denise; granddaughter, Tara Crone, great-grandchildren, Alston,

Raegen and Russ Crone and several nieces and nephews.
