



Giles Lehnertz

January 14, 1922 - May 4, 2007

Funeral services for Mr. Giles Morris "Bub" Lehnertz, 85 of Tyler will be held at 1:30pm on Monday, May 7, 2007 at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception. Officiating will be Msgr. Joseph Strickland. Burial will follow at Rose Hill Cemetery. Visitation will be at Stewart Family Funeral Home on Sunday, May 6, from 5:00 to 6:00 pm and a Rosary will follow. He passed away on Friday, May 4. Mr. Lehnertz moved to Tyler in 1951 and was an independent oil & gas operator and Professional Engineer. Mr. Lehnertz was born on January 14, 1922 in Muenster, Texas to Joseph H. and Agnes C. Fette Lehnertz. He graduated from Sacred Heart High School in Muenster and at the outbreak of World War II, enlisted in the U. S. Navy. He served aboard the aircraft carrier, U.S.S. Wasp, where he received a Citation "for distinguished service and meritorious performance of duty as a Rangefinder Operator during dive bombing attack by enemy planes" from Admiral C. W. Nimitz. In 1949, Mr. Lehnertz graduated from The University of Houston with a degree in Petroleum Engineering and worked for Schlumberger until 1963. Mr. Lehnertz is credited with developing several oil & gas fields in the East Texas area including the L.C.G. (Page) Field in Harrison, County, the Alligator Creek (Sub-Clarksville) Field in Navarro, County, and the Martha Ann (Travis Peak) Field in Smith County. In 1992, he was an honoree of the Hard Hatters Energy Club of Dallas. He was a longtime usher at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception. He was also a member of the East Texas Geological Society, the I.P.A.A., and Willow Brook Country Club. He was a charter member of the

Tyler Petroleum Club and the Petroleum Data Library. He was an avid hunter and outdoorsman. He is survived by his wife of 50 years, Martha Ann Roy Lehnertz of Tyler; two daughters, Mary Lauren Faulkner and husband, Bruce of Tyler and Lanette Smith and husband, Wallace Smith of Austin; grandchildren, Campbell Lehnertz Faulkner of Omaha, Nebraska, Madison Morgan Smith, Martha Lauren Smith, and Noble Lehnertz Smith all of Austin; a sister, Delores Shively of Memphis, Tennessee; brothers, Quenten Lehnertz, Dave Lehnertz and Donny Lehnertz, all of Spokane, WA, Floyd Lehnertz of Providence, RI and Claude Lehnertz of Idaho. He was preceded in death by both parents, and brothers Gene Lehnertz, Earl Lehnertz and Jimmy Lehnertz.
