Hassell Cook, wonderful daughter, sister, wife, mother, grandmother and great-grandmother, passed away at her home in Tyler on Wednesday, December 17, 2008. She was born in Winona, Texas on March 3, 1928 to John and Kittie Branch. She graduated from John Tyler High School where she was a member of the Blue Brigade. She attended the Stamps Quartet singing schools in Dallas as a teenager. Hassell and her two sisters sang in a trio and were known as the Branch Sisters. She was a dental assistant to Dr. DeAngelo until her marriage in 1947 to Sam Bundy Cook. Hassell was a homemaker and later a cafeteria manager for the Tyler Independent School District, from which she was retired. She was a member of Pleasant Retreat United Methodist Church, where she previously sang in the choir.

Hassell was preceded in death by her parents, husband and grandson, Danny Haen. She is survived by her three children, Nancy Green of Bedford, Patti Meyer of Nebraska, and Adam Cook of New Hampshire; sister, Hazel Weeks of Tyler; four grandchildren, Ericka Robinson of Bedford, Bundy Haen of Nebraska, Dusty Meyer of Nebraska, and Amanda Clark of New Hampshire; and four great-grandchildren, Sarah Robinson, Danielle Robinson, Patrick Haen and Piper Haen.
