James Albert Kane (77) died on Wednesday, May 17, 2006. Mr. Kane was born on June 30, 1928 in Geneva, New York, to the late Dr. Albert J. Kane and Elizabeth Hobbins Kane. He was preceded in death by his parents and his sister, Joanne Kane who died at age 19. He was a graduate of DeSales High School in Geneva, New York. He attended Syracuse University and Hobart College, and graduated from the Freeman Business Institute in Geneva, New York. He was a Master Sergeant in the Army during the Korean War, assigned to the European Ski Patrol. He was one of the founding members of the Young Republicans Club in Geneva, New York. Mr. Kane was Executive Vice President of Lady Arrow, division of Cluett, Peabody & Company in New York, New York. In 1979, Mr. Kane and his wife moved to Dallas, Texas, and eventually settled in the East Texas Area at Emerald Bay Community located on Lake Palestine. He helped the Emerald Bay Men's Golf Association ("MGA") start a college scholarship fund for Bullard High School graduates. Mr. Kane, with his wife, founded, owned and operated Lake Palestine, Emerald Bay Realty located on Highway 155 in Dogwood City. He was a member of the Tyler Board of Realtors for 22 years.
