Jim attended Texas A&M University and was a member of the Corp of Cadets and the Fighting Texas Aggie Band. He graduated from University of North Texas and received a Masters Degree from Stephen F. Austin University. After serving in the Army, Jim and Wanda, his loving wife, returned to Tyler where he began his career with the Tyler Independent School District. Jim taught Industrial Education at Moore Junior High and later served as the Principal until his retirement. He was also the co-owner of Tiny's Shack Custom Smoked meats for many years. Jim was a longtime member of Glenwood Church of Christ where he served as an Elder and Deacon. He taught Sunday School and sang beautiful tenor. He dearly loved his church family. As a boy, he was trained by his grandfather to whittle and carve. His amazing woodworking talent is on display in homes all around the country. He was truly a gifted artist. Jim is preceded in death by his sister Margaret Ann Jones. He is survived by his loving family including his wife of 54 years, Wanda Barton Trotter; daughter, Reanne Barber and husband George of Dallas; two granddaughters, Allison and Claire Barber; and several loving cousins, nieces and nephews and a
