After he began having more health issues, we weren't able to talk every day but I have one very special memory. Just a few days ago he called me and we had the best conversation - just like ones we used to have before he became so sick. I was so surprised at the difference in that conversation. I even quizzed him on several things to see if he would remember and he passed with flying colors.

I loved Jerry so much and will miss him terribly; however I am so

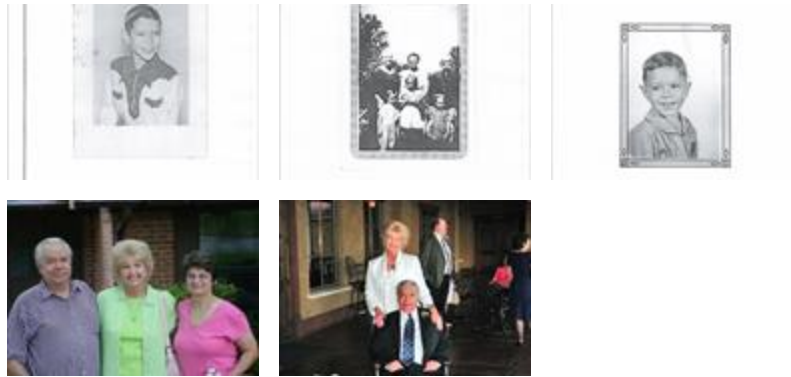
happy to know that now he is safe in the arms of Jesus, free of all pain and suffering and able to breath without help from machines, etc

Lois we love you and all the family so much. Please take care of yourself.

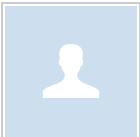
