In his professional life and personal life, Jon generously shared his time, energy, passion, and enthusiasm by providing caring and encouraging mentorship.

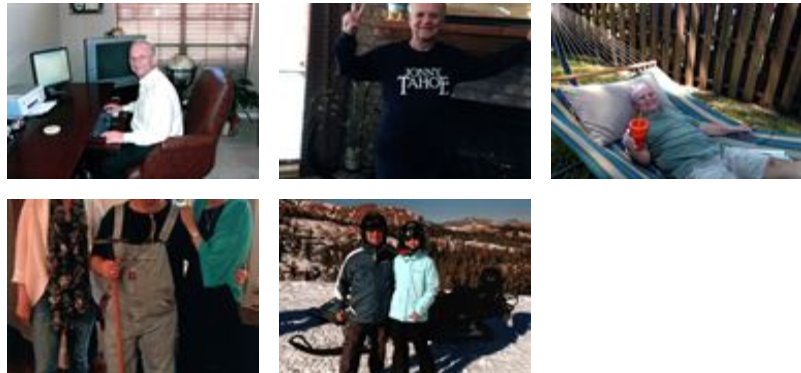
