



## Josephine "Josie" Feducia Atkinson

She was a career woman, when it "wasn't cool" and a divorced mom, when that carried a stigma. She was a football aficionado and enjoyed her "trips to the boats." She never wavered in her devotion to her family. She was a great teacher and cook. We all think fondly of her when we enjoy her recipes.

A trail blazer, independent, strong-willed and determined, these were her hallmarks. At the same time, she was devoted, loving and compassionate.

She never failed to set a good example. Josephine "Josie" Atkinson truly was

an inspiration to friends and family. She lived frugally, but had a generous spirit, always willing to share what she had with a grandchild in college or a family member in need.

She died peacefully and unexpectedly on Friday, January 31, 2014 after a brief illness.

Josie was preceded in death by her father and mother, Vincent and Anna Feducia; brothers, Joe, Sam, Tony and Guy Feducia; sisters, Johanna Feducia, Amelia Tidwell, Ann Clark, Fay Spataro and Rose Feducia.

She is survived by her son, John Atkinson and wife Glenda, and her daughter, Lynda Drake; grandchildren, Bryan Gronke, Katie Atkinson and Jay Atkinson; great-grandchildren, Claire, Sydney and Harper Bryson, whom she referred to as "the prettiest little girls you ever saw."
