She was a breadwinner at the age of 26 thus, she continued to support her family but her savings was not sufficient to sustain her family needs. tagged as she met her husband, Walter, in Bahrain. They were both working until they decided to move to the Philippines where they were happily married in 1996. Later on, Julia moved to the United States with her husband Walter and settled in Tyler, Texas in 2005. They were eventually joined by her son, Monchito.

They both became members and devoted parishioners of the Cathedral of Immaculate Conception in Tyler. 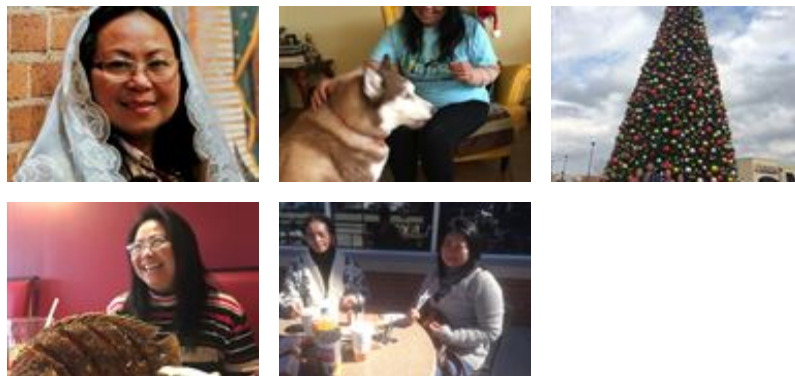

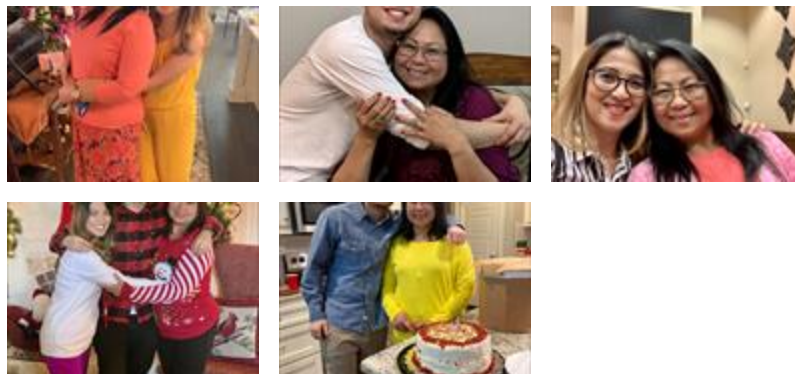

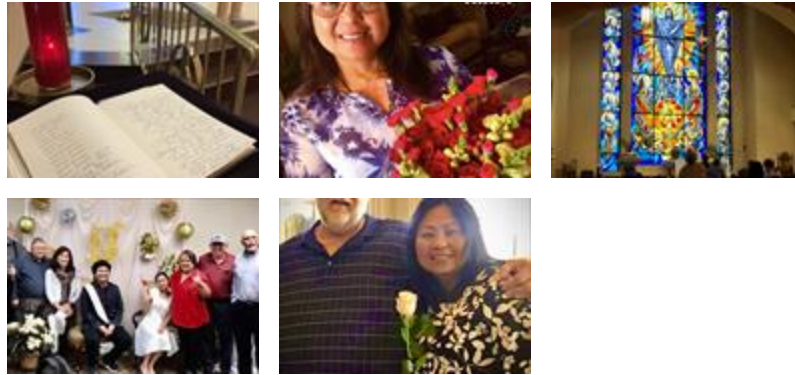
