She had a brilliant mind grasping details and numbers working as an accountant. She was also sensitive and discerning with people. She was quite talented and creative whether drawing a sketch, working with wood repairing a piece of furniture, laying a tile floor, or sewing a quilt. As the years passed, we did not see each other as often. When we did it was as if there had been no time between visits. Wynn was a truly special person. I am and will forever be grateful for her presence in my life.
