He was born January 19, 1957 in Norman, Oklahoma to Bob Gene and Maxine Meltabarger Frazier. Keith grew up in Texarkana, TX and graduated from Texas High in 1975 and then went to Stephen F. Austin State University in Nacogdoches graduating in 1979. He graduated from Texas A & M Medical School in 1991 and completed his residency in internal medicine and pediatrics from the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences in Little Rock, Arkansas. Dr. Frazier was affiliated with the Trinity Mother Frances Health System from 1995-2005 and with Hospice of East Texas for the past three years. Keith was faithful to the Lord Jesus Christ and devoted to serving Him in every area of his life. He was preceded in death by his father Bob Frazier. Dr. Frazier is survived by his loving family including his wife Terri Jernigan Frazier of Tyler; daughters, Rebekah, Amy and Hannah Frazier of Tyler; mother, Maxine Frazier; brother's, Bobby Frazier and wife Kim of Magnolia, and Phil Frazier; and sister, Yolanda Cook and husband Tommy of Texarkana, TX.
