Services for Lowry Lee Gibson, 85, Tyler, will be held on Wednesday, September 5, 2012 at 1:30 PM at Stewart Family Funeral Home Chapel with Major Ben Lawrence and Major Doris Lawrence officiating. Visitation will be Wednesday, September 5, 2012, at 1:00 PM, 30 minutes prior to the service. Mr. Gibson passed away August 30, 2012 at his residence in Tyler. He was born October 6, 1926 in Little Rock, Arkansas to Lonnie and Anna Avery Gibson. Lee joined the US Marines in 1942. He retired as a Sergeant Major in 1969 after 27 years of service. Lee was a veteran of WWII in the Pacific Theatre, the Korean War, Vietnam War and the China Marine Service. Following his military career, Lee worked as a Mechanical Engineer for Disney Land and retired after 20 years of service. Lee also volunteered for the Salvation Army for over 20 years. Lee is preceded in death by his parents. He is survived by his loving family including his wife of 63 years, Anne Gibson; son, Marc Gibson of Los Angeles, CA; daughters, Lora Gibson Uptegrove of Rogers, AR and Lou Anne Gibson of Gainesville, TX; and sister Roseanne Kennedy of Little Rock, AR.
