A joyful person, she maintained a merry heart despite the several disappointments and bewilderments that came her way across her many

years. Lillian was a lover of people, a lover of animals, a person of order and courage, a true toiler for the most beautiful of mortal beliefs. Always, she wished and worked for the best for those around her. Lillian was predeceased by her beloved mother, Ida C. Campbell, and beloved stepfather, Robert B.
