



Loretta Van Cleave

August 27, 1938 - July 3, 2010

Loretta Lucas Van Cleave, devoted wife, loving mother, and faithful friend, passed away peacefully on July 3 after an unexpected illness. Loretta was known for her deep and lasting relationships with her husband, children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren. She was 71. Loretta was born in Dalhart, TX to C.C. and Zumie Lucas. A member of a large Dalhart family, she grew up in Dalhart and married her husband, Bob Van Cleave, on December 15, 1956. The couple lived in Kerrville, TX and Tennessee Colony, TX for a brief time, before moving to Tyler in 1963. Survivors include her husband of 53 years, her daughter and son-in-law Tamra and Travis Pierce of Tyler, her son and daughter-in-law Robert and Sharon Van Cleave of Dallas, her son and daughter-in-law Luke and Laurie Van Cleave of Johns Creek, GA and her daughter and son-in-law Karen and Mark Gruver of Dallas. She taught kindergarten and 2nd grade at Grace Community School for over 10 years. In addition to spending quality time with her family, putting in the garden, and taking long walks, Loretta loved the opportunity to invest in the lives of people, as shown by her passion for teaching and ministering to the needs of those that God brought across her path. Loretta was an especially gifted writer of poetry, and her many poems are a testament to her love for her God, her family and her friends. She was preceded in death by her parents, her sister Virginia Lucas, her sister Florence Combs, and her brother, Edsel Lucas.
