



## Margaret "Peg" Myers

March 9, 1931 - June 28, 2014

A memorial service for Margaret (Peg) Myers will be held at the First Presbyterian Church, Tyler, on Tuesday, July 1, 2014 at 11:00am with Rev. Dr. Stuart Baskin officiating under the direction of Stewart Family Funeral Home. Margaret (Peg) Myers died Saturday June 28, 2014 in Emerald Bay, Texas. She was 83.
