



## Mary Pollard Heines

March 2, 1932 - February 12, 2025

Mary, a native of Tyler, Texas, entered this world on a significant day, Texas Independence Day, March 2, 1932. She was born to Senator Tomas G. Pollard, Sr., and Edna Martin Pollard, growing up in the embrace of their farm on the historic Troup Highway. It was here, under the nurturing guidance of her mother, that Mary developed a passion for gardening, a lifelong pursuit that brought her immense joy and fulfillment.

Rooted in the rich soil of Van Zandt County, where both her parents hailed from, Mary's early years were shaped by the close-knit communities of Edom and Wills Point. Family was the cornerstone of her life. Mary's professional journey was one of passion and dedication. For over 25 years, she served as a commercial real estate property manager, leasing agent, and asset manager for Pollard-Heines buildings, forging lasting relationships with colleagues and clients alike.

Beyond her professional pursuits, Mary was a devoted mother, grandmother, and volunteer. She found joy in hosting family gatherings, engaging in lifelong philanthropic endeavors with organizations such as the Philanthropic Educational Organization (PEO), and indulging in her favorite pastime, bridge.

In the later years of her life, Mary cherished moments spent with loved ones, especially her grandchildren, affectionately known as "Mimi." Whether cheering on her grandchildren at basketball and soccer games, hosting gatherings in her home, or embarking on adventures across the globe with friends and family, Mary's presence was a source of unwavering strength and love.

Mary is preceded in death by her parents and her brother, Tomas G. Pollard, Jr. She is survived by her brother Jack W. Pollard (Janelle) of Tyler, her sons Blair Heines (Dina) of Scurry, Mayor Martin Heines (Michelle) of Tyler and Anna Maria, FL, and Clinton Heines, along with her cherished grandchildren, great-grandson, nieces, and nephews.
