Maudie Fay Wilson passed away on August 21, 2020 at the age of 90.

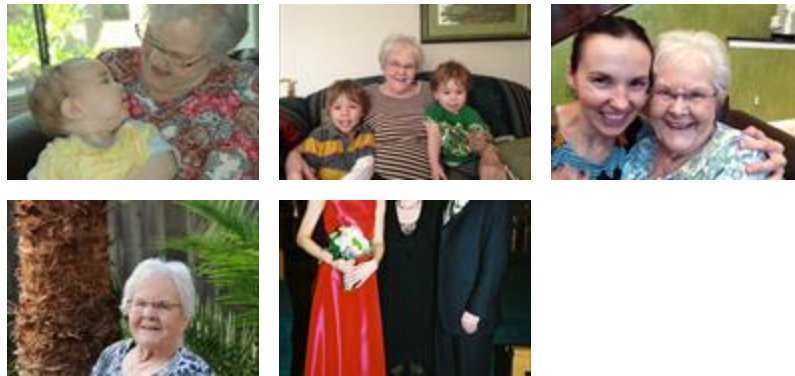

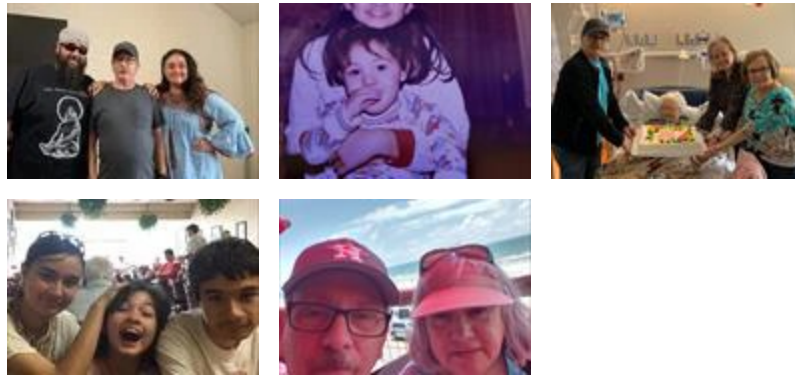

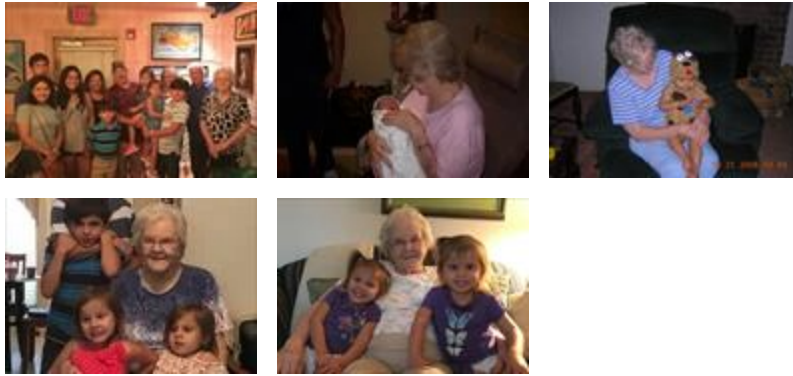
