Graveside services for Max Covnet, 86, of Tyler will be held Tuesday, March 30, 2010 at 11:30 AM at Tyler Memorial Park Cemetery with Mary Bates officiating under the direction of Stewart Family Funeral Home. Mr.

Covnet passed away on March 27, 2010 in Tyler. He was born November 25, 1923 in Dallas to the late Frank and Ella Covnet. He spent his childhood in Tyler where he graduated from Tyler High School and Tyler Junior College. Mr. Covnet proudly served his country in the U.S. Army during World War II, receiving the Bronze Star where he served overseas for four years. He served in the 97th Infantry Division in Germany and later in Japan as part of the occupation troops. Mr. Covnet was later employed at the Tyler Post Office, retiring in 1984 after 32 years of service. He was a member of Marvin United Methodist Church. He was also a member of the Tyler Lodge 1233, the Scottish Rite of Waco, and the Sharon Temple, where he was a former member of the Jeep Patrol. In addition to his parents, Mr.

Covnet was preceded in death by his wife, Gwynne Covnet and his sister, Pauline Boydell. He is survived by his son, David Covnet and Virginia; grandsons, Chris Covnet, Craig Covnet, and Colin Covnet; and several nieces.
