She was an accomplished author who published two children's books, "Puppy Breath" and "Powdery Gray". She loved animals, working, traveling, reading and swimming. Her children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren were her passion. She enjoyed slumber parties and girl trips.

Patsy loved Jesus more than anything though and she would share that love

with the many Jesus lessons she would give her children. As a member of St. Paul United Methodist Church, she attended many Bible studies and volunteered wherever she was needed. With the enjoyment of writing Patsy would send cards to Sunday school members, friends and family for all occasions.

Patsy was preceded in death by her parents.
