January 27, 1927 - April 24, 2009

Services for Randy Rogers, 82, of Emerald Bay will be held on Monday, April 27, 2009 at 1:30 PM at Emerald Bay Community Church with Rev. Jay Riley officiating. Mr. Rogers passed away on April 24, 2009 in Bullard, a resident of the Emerald Bay Community for 32 years. He was born on January 27, 1927 in Henderson to the late Thomas and Annie Sue Rogers. He was a survivor of the New London school explosion on March 18, 1937. Mr. Rogers was active in track and football, becoming a four-year letterman at Texas Christian University. After college, he owned a Humble service station for 15 years and worked for LaGloria oil refinery for 24 years. Mr. Rogers was a member of Emerald Bay Community Church, the TCU Ex-Letterman Association, the TCU Alumni Association and the Emerald Bay Club Golden Tees. He also enjoyed coaching Little League Baseball for many years. Mr. Rogers is survived by a loving family including his wife of 59 years, Shirley Smith Rogers; a daughter, DeBe Rogers Wantzloebe and husband Kenneth of Boerne; a son, Randall Smith "Smitty" Rogers and wife Letty of Corpus Christi; six grandsons, Blanton Earl Albright, Dayne Weldon Albright, Randall E. Rogers, Dillon Ryan Rogers, Marcos Rogers and Ben Martinez; six great-grandchildren, Baileigh Albright, Lucus Rogers, Reagan Rogers, Bella Rogers, Bronwyn Martinez and Rowan Martinez; a brother, Wayne Rogers of Metairie, Louisiana; two sisters, Clifford Short of Indianapolis, Indiana and Lois Green of Henderson.
