



## Richmond K. Dorsey

October 27, 1926 - January 12, 2018

Richmond Kendall Dorsey passed away on January 12, 2018. He was born on October 27, 1926 in Wichita Falls, Texas to Joe Kendall Dorsey and Mary Sanders Dorsey and then moved to Fort Worth, Texas. He attended schools in Fort Worth where he graduated from Arlington Heights High School.

Richmond served in the Navy from 1944 to 1946. He and Mary Elizabeth Simmons married at the First Methodist Church in Fort Worth in 1949. He graduated from Texas Christian University in 1950 with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Psychology. After a career in pharmaceutical sales in San Antonio, he retired to Tyler for the past 38 years.
