Robert "Bob" Millet was born and raised in Erie, PA to parents Lloyd and Margaret Millet. He graduated from Wesleyville High School in 1964 then served in the US Navy from 1964-1968. He was a telephone switch repairman aboard the aircraft carrier USS Hancock during the Vietnam era. After graduation from Fisher Auto Body School, he partnered with his father Lloyd Millet to found Millet Collision on 12th St. in Erie and later Buffalo Rd. in Wesleyville until Bob moved on to Arlington, TX to form Millet Collision #2 which he operated for several years. He worked for 25 years for LTV and 5 years for Bell Helicopter as a tool maker of jigs for critical helicopter and aircraft parts. Bob was an ordained minister and served the Lord in prison ministry for many years. A full military honors service and interment will be held on January 6, 2015 at the Dallas Ft. Worth National Cemetery in Dallas.

Bob is survived by his wife Carolyn of Tyler, TX, siblings Carolyn McPherson (Lee), David Millet (Dannette), Charles Millet (Lorelei), Alan Millet (Rhonda), Pamela Rodland (Perry) and Kathleen Stoddard (Eric), stepchildren Christine Leon and John Gallivan and two step-grandchildren. He will also lovingly be remembered by 18 nieces and nephews and 10 great nieces and nephews.
