Services for Roy E. Parker, 72, of Whitehouse will be held on Wednesday, July 2, 2008 at 10:00 AM at Stewart Family Funeral Home with Dr. Darryle Dunks officiating. Burial will be held at the DFW National Cemetery in Dallas.

Mr. Parker passed away on June 30, 2008 at Briarcliff Health Center in Tyler. He was born on November 27, 1935 in Miller City, Illinois to the late Howard Samuel and Pernecia Mae Burns Parker. He was raised in Illinois and joined the Air Force at age 18. After his military service, he worked as an Allstate insurance agent. Mr. Parker served as treasurer and deacon at Sun Valley Baptist Church in El Paso for many years. He moved to the Tyler area in 2003 and was a faithful member of Green Acres Baptist Church where he joined the Sonshine class. Mr. Parker enjoyed reading, military history, and was an avid fan of the Dallas Cowboys. Most of all, he was a devoted husband, father, and grandfather. In addition to his parents, Mr. Parker was preceded in death by four brothers and two sisters. He is survived by a loving family including his wife of 51 years, Margaret Parker of Whitehouse; daughter, Deborah Braus of Whitehouse; three sons, Rory Parker and wife Sheila Cassidy of Atlanta, Georgia, Garry Parker of Palestine, and Stephen Parker of El Paso; sister, Mary Cox of Salem, Oregon; brothers, Charles Beaver and wife Diane, and Donny Beaver and wife Audry, all of Salem, Oregon; and six grandchildren.
