October 22, 1931 - June 22, 2007

Samuel James Kennedy was born on October 22, 1931 and passed from this life on June 22, 2007. Sam was born in Albuquerque, New Mexico to Robert and Grace Kennedy. He grew up in Raton, New Mexico and graduated from New Mexico A & M in Los Cruces in 1958. He and his wife Dorothy were married on December 31, 1959 in Portales, New Mexico, and shared 47 years of marriage together. Sam retired with 30 years of government service, working in Portales, New Mexico; Amarillo, Texas; and Salem, Oregon; and ending in Denver, Colorado; where he retired as Chief of Economic Analysis Branch of the Bureau of Reclamation. His job required many travels including Brazil and to China where he was an advisor to the Chinese government in developing the Three Gorges Dam on the Yangtze River. Sam and Dorothy raised a family including 2 sons and 2 daughters. They lived 38 years in Denver, Colorado. Sam was a private pilot and enjoyed traveling all over the world. Sam was a member of the Bear Valley Church of Christ for 38 years and served as an elder for the last five. Sam received the greatest joy administering to the members of his congregation providing a lasting influence on them. Sam and Dorothy moved to Tyler 8 months ago where they are members of the West Erwin Church of Christ. Sam served his Lord until the end. Sam was a tall man with broad shoulders that were able to hold the problems and cares of many. Whether family or friends, everyone who knew him knew they had a friend they could rely on.
