She attended the University of Texas in Austin where she was a member of Kappa Kappa Gamma Sorority. In addition to her parents, Mrs. Baker was preceded in death by her husband, Billy Allen Baker and her youngest son, Allen Tedder Baker. She is survived by her eldest son, William E. Baker of Tyler.
