Mr. Van Os passed away Wednesday, September 5, 2012 in Tyler. He was born December 15, 1922 in Shreveport, Louisiana to Seymour Van Os and Lucile Samuel Van Os. Seymour was a member of Congregation Beth El where he taught Sunday school and was also a Board Member. He was in the United States 3rd Army as a Combat Engineer and First Lieutenant. Seymour was a Legion of Honor member of the Society of Petroleum Engineers and a recipient of the Silver Beaver Award of the Boy Scouts of America serving for 25 years as a Scout Master. He was a Democratic Party Precinct Chairman for over 20 years. Mr. Van Os was a member of the Geological Society and the Landman's Association. Mr. Van Os taught Petroleum Engineering at both Tyler Junior College and Kilgore College. He retired from Petroleum engineering and teaching school. In addition to his parents, Mr. Van Os was preceded in death by brother, David Van Os and daughter-in-law, Claudia Van Os. He is survived by his loving family including his wife of 64 years, Francene Davis Van Os; sons, David Van Os and wife Rachel of Austin and Louis Van Os of Ocean Springs, Mississippi; grandchildren, Jay and Kaycee Cole of San Antonio, Maya and Leya Van Os of Austin and Jennifer Van Os of Ocean Springs, Mississippi and brother Herman Van Os and wife Jean of Baton Rouge, Louisiana.
