Of all her many successes, she excelled most of all as a Christian, trusting in the Lord with all her heart mind and soul, as a

friend and neighbor, and as a Mom. Scott and Grant Guthrie could not have had a finer Mother. Shirley was a member of Rose Heights Church of God and loved the Lord deeply.
