He was born on January 4, 1915 in Athens, Texas to the late Grover and Annie Barron Layton. After graduating from high school in Athens, Mr. Layton attended Texas Tech and North Texas University. He married Elizabeth Noah Layton, and they raised two sons, Donald and Mike, and a daughter, Cindy. Mrs. Layton passed away in 1991. They were founding members of Ross Avenue Christian Church and charter members of First Christian Church in Tyler. Mr. Layton will be remembered as a great father and family man. Mr. Layton worked as a very successful Sales Representative for White Swann Food Service Company and became the first institutional food representative to sell over one million dollars in product before his retirement in 1980.
